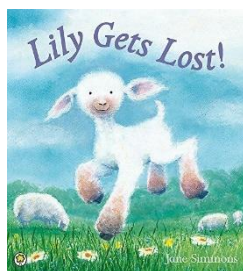


Friday 3rd March 2023

Dear parents and carers,

We have had a fabulous week in Nursery learning lots of new things including;

- Matching mummy animals to their babies and learning their names eg a baby cow is called a calf, a baby pig is called a piglet.
- Counting how many legs different animals have and matching them to the correct number.
- Learning what to do if we get lost, who we can ask for help and about strangers and safer strangers.
- Continuing our healthy me topic by moving our bodies to the song 'I like to move it, move it'. Making our hearts beat faster!
- Making silly soup with rhyming words.
- Learning all about ladybirds and their life cycles from egg, to pupa, to larvae, to ladybird.



We read 'Lily gets lost' which is a story about a lamb who wonders off from her mummy and gets lost. The children enjoyed joining in with the story making the animal noises and helping Lily to find her mama at the end. They have produced some beautiful paintings, collages and writing which we are going to put up on display in the nursery.

We also read 'What the ladybird heard' the children enjoyed making their own maps of the farm from the story and acting out the end part where the police catch the bad guys in our police station outside.

We had so much fun celebrating world book day and loved seeing all of the children dressed up in their costumes of their favourite book characters!

You can help your child to continue their learning at home by:

- Practising to write their name.
- Teaching them to do up their zip or their buttons on their coat.
- Asking them to sing you our new songs of the week '5 little ducks' and 'Ladybird, ladybird fly away home'.
- Talking to your child about keeping safe when you are out and about and teaching them the first line of your address.

Next week we will be exploring colour mixing and learning all about the Holi festival which takes place on Wednesday. Please complete the homework that has been sent home in your child's book bag with them and send it into school with them next week as part of our learning about colour.
