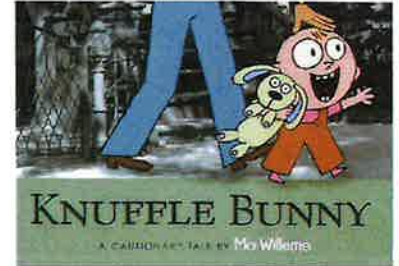
As mentioned in the previous curriculum letter, we have been using the 'Read Write Inc' approach to teaching early reading and phonics. Every Friday your child will be given a phonics book to practice reading at home. Please return the book to school the following Friday.

Autumn Term Learning

This half term we will be learning the following in each subject area.

English

Year 1 will continue reading a range of storybooks. They will focus on retelling the stories in their own words. They will be looking at a range of key grammar features and vocabulary and will use those features to support them in their independent writing. Later in the term, they will be looking at Losing Tales. We will be using 'Knuffle Bunny' as our core text and the children will write their own losing tales, using the same structure as Knuffle Bunny.



Mathematics

In maths this half term, Year 1 will be learning about addition and subtraction. They will learn their number bonds to 10, learn how to write number sentences and learn how to solve both addition and subtraction problems. Later in the term, year 1 will be introduced to Geometry where they will learn about various shapes.

Physical Education

P.E. will be taking place in Year 1 on a Tuesday and Thursday. Please ensure you send your child to school wearing their P.E. kits on these days.

Redwood class will be doing Forest School on a Monday, which will replace the Thursday PE lesson.

The outdoor P.E. unit this term is called 'Invasion Games'. Children will learn different ways of travelling, including moving backwards, sidestepping and changing direction. They will apply these different methods of travelling as they move onto travelling with a ball.



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The indoor P.E. unit this term is called 'Dance: Starry Skies'. The children will experiment with dancing with objects and pretending to dance with them. They make shapes with objects, their bodies and others, hold them and move in them. The children copy and develop dance patterns of their own to the music. The unit draws upon exciting stimuli that link well to cross-curricular themes, including fireworks and astronauts.

Music

We are very fortunate to have a specialist music teacher in school every Tuesday to teach Year 1 music lessons, focusing on singing and percussion.

Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education

The P.S.H.E unit 'Celebrating Difference' will explore the similarities and differences between people. Year 1 will explore what bullying means and will understand the importance of telling someone they trust if they or someone else is being bullied or feeling unhappy.

In **Science**, year 1 will be learning about materials, and then will use this knowledge to sort them into different categories – attached is a knowledge organiser with more information about what the children will be learning this unit.

In **History**, year 1 will be learning about 'Significant Explorers'. In this unit, children explore why some people are considered to be significant before going on to learn about some significant explorers – attached is a knowledge organiser with more information about what the children will be learning this unit.

In **Religious Education**, the children will be learning about 'Gifts and Giving'. They will be thinking about different types of gifts we can give and why giving is important by exploring the Christian celebration Christmas and the Islamic festival Eid-al-Fitr – attached is a knowledge organiser with more information about what the children will be learning this unit.

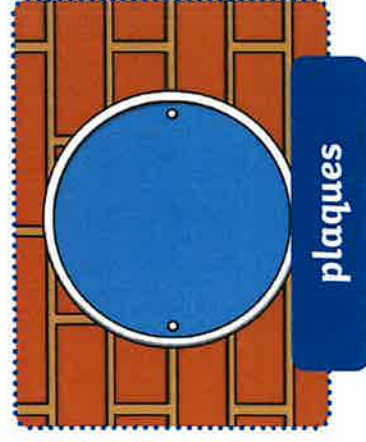

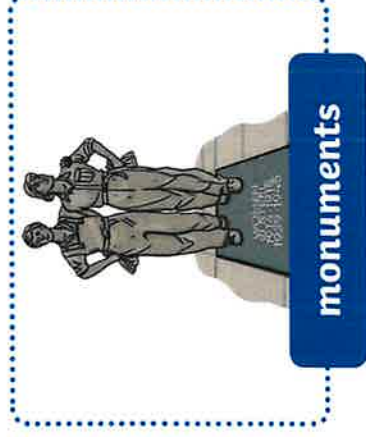


Remembering Significant People

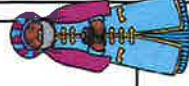

The Nativity Story

The Angel Gabriel visited Mary and told her she was going to have a baby called Jesus and that he would be God's son.

Mary and Joseph had to travel to Bethlehem. A kind innkeeper in Bethlehem let Mary and Joseph stay in his stable for the night and Jesus was born there.

An angel appeared to some shepherds and told them that the son of God had been born in Bethlehem. The shepherds walked to Bethlehem to visit the baby Jesus.

Some Wise Men saw a star in the sky and knew that it meant a king had been born. They followed the star. They went past the palace of King Herod who asked the men to tell him where the baby was. The Wise Men found baby Jesus but they received a message from God warning them not to tell Herod so they didn't.

Herod began to search for Jesus. He ordered that all baby boys in Bethlehem be killed. However, after a warning in a dream, Mary and Joseph travelled to Egypt with Jesus and he was safe.



Christmas Traditions

The story of the birth of Jesus is very important to Christians. Many believe he was a gift from God.

People celebrate **Christmas** in lots of different ways and these include acting out a **nativity**, carol singing, putting up and decorating **Christmas** trees and hanging wreaths. Many families get together for a special meal on **Christmas Day**.

Many Christians give gifts at **Christmas** to show their love for one another. After his birth, the Wise Men gave Jesus special gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. They were the kinds of gifts given to kings at that time. They were very valuable and were probably the first **Christmas** presents.

Ramadan

Ramadan is a very special time for many Muslims. It celebrates the time when the **Qur'an** was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad (Peace Be Upon Him). It is celebrated at a different time every year because Islam uses a lunar calendar, which is based on the cycles of the moon.

During **Ramadan**, many Muslims **fast** during daylight hours. Often, they go to the mosque to read the **Qur'an**.

Many Muslims **fast** during Ramadan because it reminds them of people in the world who have less than they do.

People who are young, elderly or ill don't have to **fast**.

Muslims will often have a meal called Suhur before sunrise and another called Iftar after sunset.

Zakat Al-Fitr is often given at this time. Many Muslims give food or money to help those in need.



Eid Al-Fitr

Eid Al-Fitr is the time when many Muslims celebrate the end of **Ramadan**. It lasts for three days and is a very special time.

During **Eid Al-Fitr**, Muslims may give thanks to Allah (God) for giving them the strength to **fast** during **Ramadan**.

It is also a time for many Muslims to think about others.

Eid Al-Fitr is celebrated in lots of different ways. Many families go to the mosque to pray. Gifts are often given and are usually opened after the morning prayer and people can exchange cards that say '**Eid Mubarak!**'
