In order for children to develop their oracy, we need to provide them with lots of opportunities to practice their speaking and listening, which we do regularly in school. We will be sharing a discussion question each week in the newsletter to also provide you with a chance to have an interesting discussion with your children and support their oracy at home. 
Year 5 Walnut class performed a special assembly on Thursday about the worry tree and how to deal with worries. Well done Walnut class for a great performance.


