In order for children to develop their oracy, we need to provide them with lots of opportunities to practice their speaking and listening, which we do regularly in school. We will be sharing a discussion question each week in the newsletter to also provide you with a chance to have an interesting discussion with your children and support their oracy at home. This week's home discussion question is:



Harefield Children's Centre Courses

Ready to go - Transition support prepare with your child for school. This will start on 28 January, please pop into the children's centre to book a place. This will help prepare your child by thinking about independence skills which includes toilet training, expressing their needs, etc.

Post natal group - Starting 12 January, please pop in or call to book a place. Have you or do you know someone who has a baby 0 to 4 months old, we have a group running at the children's centre.
